## Get Certified

The NWA Broadcast Meteorology Committee promotes the development of quality television, radio and internet weathercasting among NWA members. Through the NWA Seal of Approval program, the NWA grants television/radio and digital Seals of Approval to NWA member weathercasters in the broadcast media (TV/Radio Seal) and in cyberspace (Digital Seal) who meet or exceed standards set by the NWA.

→ Applicants for the NWA Seal of Approval must:

- Be A full (regular) member in good standing and at least 21 years of age
- Be currently employed as a commercial on-air weathercaster (digital - produce original internet weather content)
- Have two years full-time or three years part-time experience
- Submit a formal letter of application and current resume
- Pass a written exam
- Pass a performance evaluation by a panel consisting of other Seal holders

## Overview:

- Covers topics relevant to all aspects of operational meteorology on a range of time and space scales
- Suitable topics include new or improved forecasting and warning techniques, verification studies, applications of observations and models to improve forecasts and warnings, and case studies of major weather events.
- Climatological studies, interdisciplinary studies, and studies documenting education and training practices are also considered if relevant to operational meteorology.
- In addition, the Editors welcome submissions that present strategies for the creation and dissemination of forecasts and warnings that maximize the protection of life and property.
